## Ascension Thursday and a Novena for Pentecost

In many dioceses of the United States, including our own, the celebration of the feast of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred to next Sunday. The Universal Church, however, celebrates the Ascension this coming Thursday, May 14th. Thursday marks the beginning of the Pentecost Novena, which is the nine days of prayer made by the Disciples who prayed for the coming of the Holy Spirit from the day the Lord departed until the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon them in the *Coenaculum* (the Cenacle: where the Last Supper was celebrated).

There is a historic *Triduum* of sorts that precedes the feast of the Ascension. On the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Thursday, the Church has historically observed three days of mourning called Rogation days. These remain as optional in the liturgy even today. We mourn during these days because our Blessed Lord has told us that He is going to depart. Rogations days are also observed “beseeching God to alleviate physical and spiritual needs, and to bless the produce of field and garden” (Parsch, The Church’s Year of Grace. Vol. 3., pg. 152). These three days may be observed with a daily procession while chanting the Litany of the Saints and the Kyrie. During the procession, the clergy wear violet vestments, not to “signify that our Jesus has fled from us, but that the time for His departure is approaching” (Gueranger, The Liturgical Year Vol. 9., p. 134).

On Ascension Thursday, the Lord ascended toward the East. The angel told the disciples that the Lord would return in the very same way. Therefore, the Church looks to the East now (signified by the Crucifix in the sanctuary and on the altar—marking the liturgical direction facing East) as she awaits the second coming of her Lord on the altar in the Eucharist. His second coming is daily manifested as He rises in the East at the Elevation of the Host and Chalice in anticipation of His glorious return at the end of time. Meanwhile, in these nine days, we, the faithful, pray the Novena to the Holy Spirit, uniting our prayer to that of the apostles, the other disciples, and the Blessed Virgin Mary in that very first novena.

### Novena Prayer

Holy Spirit, Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, Spirit of truth, love and holiness, proceeding from the Father and the Son, and equal to Them in all things, I adore You and love You with all my heart.

Dearest Holy Spirit, confiding in Your deep personal love for me, I am making this novena for the following request, if it should be Your holy Will to grant it: (*mention your request*).

Teach me, Divine Spirit, to know and seek my last end; grant me the holy fear of God; grant me true contrition and patience. Do not let me fall into sin. Give me an increase of faith, hope, and charity, and bring forth in my soul all the virtues proper to my state of life.

Make me a faithful disciple of Jesus and an obedient child of the Church. Give me efficacious grace sufficient to keep the Commandments and to receive the Sacraments worthily. Give me the four Cardinal Virtues, Your Seven Gifts, Your Twelve Fruits. Raise me to perfection in the state of life to which You have called me and lead me through a happy death to everlasting life. I ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

### Consecration

Holy Spirit, Divine Spirit of light and love, I consecrate to You my understanding, heart, and will, my whole being, for time and for eternity. May my understanding be always submissive to Your heavenly inspirations and to the teaching of the Catholic Church, of which You are the infallible Guide. May my heart be ever inflamed with the love of God and of my neighbor. May my will be ever conformed to the Divine Will. May my whole life be faithful to the imitation of the life and virtues of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to Whom with the Father and You be honor and glory forever.

God, Holy Spirit, Infinite Love of the Father and the Son, through the pure hands of Mary, Your Immaculate Spouse, I place myself this day, and all the days of my life, upon Your chosen altar, the Divine Heart of Jesus, as a sacrifice to You, consuming fire, being firmly resolved now more than ever to hear Your voice and to do in all things Your most holy and adorable Will. Amen.
